

## **New and Returning Green Reaper Perennials 2021**

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**Aconitum Eleanor:** White and purple flower

**Anemone Honorine Jobert:** Fall white

**Aquilegia Kirigami:** Deep blue with white

**Artemisia Silver Mound**

**Astrantia:** Long blooming pincushion type blooms in white, blush, pinks, and maroon

**Aster Little Carlow:** Late fall multitudes of brilliant lavender-blue blooms

**Astilbe Korean Splendor:** Extra tall arendsii type with lavender blooms, can reach 6ft.

**Astilbe Purperkerse:** Bright purple pink, 4 to 5 feet.

**Campanula lactiflora:** Milky bellflower in blues and lavenders, 3 to 4 feet.

**Coreopsis Berry Chiffon:** Cream with a raspberry eye

**Coreopsis Sun Kiss:** Yellow with burgundy centers

**Crocus sativa:** Purple Saffron Crocus blooms in October

**Ursula's Red:** Burgundy version of painted fern

**Red Rambler Fern:** Red stemmed spreading fans 15 in.

## **GRASSES:**

**Miscanthus Little Nikki**

**Helianthus salicifolius:** Willow-leaved perennial sunflower

**Heliopsis Bleeding Hearts:** Burgundy foliage, orange blooms

**Helleborus Flower Girl:** Double blush pink

**Helleborus Shotgun Wedding:** Double white with burgundy speckling

**Helenium Red Shades**

**Hosta Dancing Queen:** Bright yellow foliage, strong grower.

**Hosta Halcyon Blue**

**Iris pseudata 'Yaria':** Peach with purple veining, bright yellow signals

**Lewisia longipetala Little Plum**

**Linum lewissii:** Long blooming pale blue flowers

**Packera aurea:** Golden Ragwort. North American native grows in wet or dry, sun or shade. Great for shady locations.

## **PEONIES:**

**Burma Joy:** Bright red single

**High Adventure:** Mid-season double pink

**Ivory Victory:** Cream and white double

**Mary Henderson:** Red japanese, yellow center

**Pillow Cases:** Early ruffled pink single

**Serene Pastel:** Blush pink double

**Primula auricula Mix**

**Primula bulleesiana**

**Polygonatum Ruby Slippers:** Red stemmed Solomon Seal, white flowers, 2ft.

**Rudbeckia triloba:** multitudes of small black-eyed susan blooms. Self-seeding biennial for us, but often described as perennial.

**Salvia argenta:** a biennial for sharply drained full sun and heat with outstanding large silver foliage

**Salvia May Night:** Deep blue/purple, 18in.

**Thalictrum Elin:** Silvery lavender blooms, 8 to 10 feet.

## **SHRUBS:**

**Lilac 'Maiden's Blush':** Plummy pink, strong bloomer, 6 to 8ft tall, our favorite.

### **Hardy Chrysanthemums**

This year we are offering Zone 4 mums from Minnesota. These are old-fashioned forms, including some quills and "football" types. They will not be tidy little cushions, but have a freer and in most cases, taller habit.

In order for them to winter-over successfully, we recommend planting them by Labor Day in a well drained sunny area and mulching them with boughs. Or bring them inside in pots and winter in above-freezing conditions and plant in the spring so they get a full season to get established.

**Belle O' The Ball:** Purple 5 inch blooms, 18in.

**Homecoming:** Salmon pink transitions to a pale buff.

**Irish Linen:** Buff white 5 to 6 inch blooms, 24in.

**Maroon Pride:** Maroon red, 20in.

**Matchsticks:** Red Quill, 20in.

**Mellow Moon:** Pale Yellow 5 inch blooms, 20in.

**Pat Lehman:** Pink, 24-30in.

**Peach Centerpiece:** Quill blooms 4 inches across, 16in.

**Stadium Queen:** Large 6 to 7 inch blooms, red with gold reverse.

**Yellow Giant:** Super hardy large yellow blooms.

### **FRUIT AND VEG**

These are young plants we will be offering at very reasonable prices. Quantities this year are limited, but if there is a big interest, we will expand our offerings next year. We'd like your feedback on what kind of fruits you are interested in for the future.

#### **Asparagus Purple Passion**

**Blueberries:** These are EARLY producing high bush to ensure a good crop before fruit fly season:

**Duke** (needs at least one other blueberry variety for a pollinator)

**Blue Ray** (needs at least one other blueberry variety for a pollinator)

**Crocus Sativus:** Saffron Crocus

**Chicago Hardy Fig** (Zone 5): Bring inside for the winter or flatten down and cover with tarped mulch or hay bales. You will also need a rodent preventative. Fruits on new canes.

**Elderberry Adams** (native or Johns for pollination)

**Elderberry Johns** (needs Adams or native for pollination)

#### **Goji Berry Phoenix Tears**

**Arctic Kiwi Anna** (needs male for pollination)

**Arctic Kiwi Clark**(male)

**Haskap Berry Indigo Treat** (needs another variety for pollination)

**Haskap Berry Tundra** (needs another variety for pollination)
